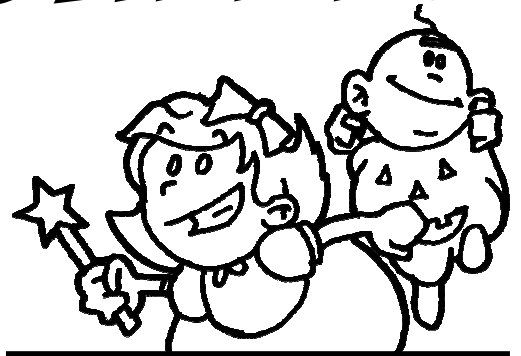


HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Trick-or-Treaters

Child Identification Kit Instructions

- A Child Identification Kit should be filled out by the parent and kept in a secure location.
- In a situation where details about the child are needed, the Child Identification Kit can provide quick information to police and the media.
- To complete the Identification Kit, fill out the information in each box. Include a current photo/current photos of the child. Using a clean comb, brush the child's hair and place about 10-20 strands in the included zip-sealed baggy.
- Using a stamp pad, ink each finger individually and press down directly in the appropriate box. Do not roll the finger, which will blur the fingerprint. If a stamp pad is not available, a dark washable marker can be used by coloring directly on the fingerprints and pressing onto the paper before it dries (test on a separate piece of paper before).
- Keep in a secure location which can easily be recalled in the case of an emergency.
